Dear Mr. Kleiser,

I am informed by my Legal Advisor that considerable progress has been made in coming to an arrangement whereby the DNA samples from Srebrenica can be tested by the defence under circumstances where the results can be considered reliable. I want to thank you for the efforts you have made to address our concerns.

I particularly appreciate the willingness of the ICMP to provide the defence with the bone-DNA profiles of all Srebrenica related cases along with their associated bar codes. After consulting with my expert, Dr. Oliver Stojkovic, I am satisfied that this will enable us, as much as reasonably possible, to detect any substitutions which might be attempted after we provide the names of the 5 persons whose samples we wish to test, as well as the means of random sampling for the remaining 295 persons.

Therefore, I would request that you now provide the bone-DNA profiles of all Srebrenica related cases along with their associated bar codes to my expert, Dr. Oliver Stojkovic. We will also need the names of the deceased persons associated with those cases. I will then provide you with the names of the five persons whose samples we wish to test.


After the testing of these 5 samples, we will inform you of the random sampling method we would like to be employed for the remaining 295 samples. Because we want to spread that sample over different years and different grave sites, we will need information associating the samples with the years and gravesites in order to establish a random sample method.
